Dear Chairman Carter and Ranking Member Price:


I write on behalf of the National Sheriffs' Association (NSA) and the more than 3,000 elected sheriffs nationwide to express our support of the National Domestic Preparedness Consortium (NDPC) in the FY2016 Homeland Security Appropriations Bill.

The NDPC is a primary training partner of the Department of Homeland Security, Federal Emergency Management Agency, National Preparedness Directorate's National Training and Education Division. The NDPC provides critical training for counter-terrorism preparedness needs of the nation's emergency first responders within the context of all hazards including chemical, biological, radiological, and explosive Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD) hazards. NSA membership depends on this training and continual support which it receives from the consortium as well as technical assistance from their subject matter experts. This is further exemplified by NSA partnering with the NDPC on the development of courses specific to the needs of sheriffs and their role in homeland security and natural disasters.

In this austere budgetary climate, your subcommittee has been given an unpleasant task of setting priorities among current programs - a number of which are important to many different stakeholder groups.
